

Cabbage

Dependable, cool-climate loving cabbage can be grown almost all year 'round in the Pacific Northwest.

- PLANTING:** Plant out with 1-2' space in between starts. Put early-harvest types out between April & May. For fall harvest, plant between Aug. & Sept.
- CULTURE:** Cabbage prefers cool, moist conditions. Keep watering consistent and avoid drastic changes in fertilization habits. Mulch around cabbages to retain soil moisture, especially in warmer weather.
- FERTILIZING:** An all-purpose organic fertilizer is best used in the soil before planting out. Within the growing season, it can be dug around each cabbage.
- HARVESTING:** Harvest early varieties as soon as they are well-formed and to their mature size. Fall varieties can stay in the garden for longer without splitting, but do cut a few of the outer leaves to keep bruising at bay.
- STORAGE:** Fall-harvest, winter-storage varieties are longer keeping; 4-6 months. Early varieties will keep up to a month or so.

Danish Ballhead	Light green, 7-10" head, weighs 5-6 lbs. Mild flavor makes it versatile for traditional uses. Excellent keeper. Tolerates hot, dry weather.	125
Dynamo	Densely packed, 2-2 1/2 lb., blue-green heads with small cores. Very weather tolerant and resistant to Fusarium Yellows.	75
Early Jersey Wakefield	Heirloom. One of the best tasting cabbages ever. Small, 1 lb. pointed heads are ready in 2 months.	65
Golden Acre	An extra fine, early cabbage with resistance to "yellows". Round heads are 6-7" across, uniform and solid. Compact plants.	60
Late Flat Dutch	Flat green, 6-7" head, weighs 3-4 lbs. Traditional favorite for fall harvests. Does well in fall frosts. Sweet and juicy, choice.	95
Ruby Ball	Firm, round, red, 6-8" head, weighs 3-4 lbs. Stands for quite a long time in the garden without losing quality. Great for winter storage.	78
Savoy Express	Small, compact, 8x6" head, weighs just over a pound. Has only a few wrapper leaves. Reliably delicious and tender.	55
